PROVERBS 22:6 (promise or principle?)

Common Misunderstanding:

- Many people interpret Proverbs 22:6 as saying that if parents raise their children "the right way," the children will always stay on that path.
- This leads to guilt and self-doubt for parents when children stray from what was taught, even if the parents made a genuine effort to raise them well.

More Accurate Interpretation:

- The Hebrew wording suggests a warning: "Train up a child in the way he should go [his own way/natural inclinations] and even when he is old he will not depart from it."
- This implies that if a child is allowed to develop bad habits or pursue selfish desires without correction, those patterns are likely to continue.
- The verse is not a guarantee but a caution against neglecting a child's upbringing and allowing them to follow their own flawed instincts.
- It emphasizes the importance of parental guidance in shaping a child's character and directing them away from harmful tendencies.

Key Points:

Not a Promise:

Proverbs 22:6 is not a guarantee of a child's future behavior, but a warning about the potential consequences of neglecting their upbringing.

Warning, Not a Guarantee:

It highlights the importance of guiding children towards positive paths and away from negative ones.
