

The Holy Spirit

The Bible indicates that the Holy Spirit's primary role is to glorify Jesus and point people to Him. Jesus himself stated that the Holy Spirit would testify about him and guide believers into all truth, which includes revealing the significance of Jesus's teachings and person. The Holy Spirit does not draw attention to himself; The Holy Spirit's actions always point beyond himself to the Father and the Son.

- **Not Speaking of _____:**

Scripture indicates that the Holy Spirit does not speak on his own authority, but rather reveals what he has heard from the Father and the Son. (John 16:14-15)

- **Testifying to _____:**

Jesus said the Holy Spirit would testify about him, and that believers would also bear witness to him because they had been with Jesus from the beginning.

- **Guiding into _____:**

The Holy Spirit guides believers into all truth, and this truth includes understanding the person and work of Jesus Christ.

- **_____ Jesus:**

The Holy Spirit does not speak of himself but rather glorifies Jesus by revealing his significance and truth.

- **Reminding of _____:**

The Holy Spirit reminds believers of everything Jesus taught, helping them to understand and apply his teachings.

- The Holy Spirit convicts the world of sin, righteousness, and judgment, and this conviction ultimately points people to Jesus as the only Savior.

- **_____ Believers:**

The Holy Spirit empowers believers to live according to God's will and to share the gospel with others, all for the glory of Jesus.

The Holy Spirit distributes spiritual gifts as He wills. This is explicitly stated in 1 Corinthians 12:11, which says, "But one and the same Spirit works all these things, distributing to each one individually as He wills," . The Holy Spirit decides which gifts each believer receives, ensuring a diversity of gifts within the church body to build it up.

- **The Holy Spirit's Sovereignty:**

The passage in 1 Corinthians 12:11 emphasizes that the Holy Spirit is the one who determines who receives which gift. This highlights the Spirit's sovereignty and freedom in bestowing gifts.

- _____ **of Gifts:**

The Bible lists various spiritual gifts, including wisdom, knowledge, faith, healing, miracles, prophecy, discerning of spirits, tongues, and interpretation of tongues. These gifts are not given to every believer in the same way or measure.

- _____ **of Gifts:**

These gifts are given to believers to serve the church and glorify God, not to elevate individuals. They are meant to build up the body of Christ and edify other believers.

- **No Human _____:**

Since the Holy Spirit distributes the gifts as He chooses, individuals cannot claim credit for the gifts they receive. The gifts are a divine endowment, not a result of human effort or desire.

- **Seeking _____ :**

While the Holy Spirit distributes gifts as He wills, the Bible also encourages believers to desire and seek spiritual gifts, particularly those that would benefit the church. However, this desire should be rooted in a desire to serve God and others, not for personal gain.

- _____ :

Some examples of spiritual gifts include the ability to speak wisdom, knowledge, faith, healing, miracles, prophecy, discerning spirits, speaking in tongues, and interpreting tongues
